

# CPT Category II Codes For HEDIS

This document provides an overview of CPT Category II Codes, which are used to capture supplemental tracking codes used for data collection related to quality performance measurement. To improve measure performance, please document and include all appropriate and applicable CPT II codes with your encounter(s). The list below includes recommended and most frequently used CPT II codes provided by CMS and NCQA, however it is not an exhaustive list.

<b>DIABETES</b>		
<b>Glycemic Status Assessment for Patients with Diabetes (GSD)</b>	3044F	Most recent HbA1c level < 7.0%
	3046F	Most recent HbA1c level > 9.0%
	3051F	Most recent HbA1c level ≥ 7.0% and < 8.0%
	3052F	Most recent HbA1c level ≥ 8.0% and < 9.0%
<b>Eye Exam for Patients with Diabetes (EED)</b>	2022F	Dilated retinal eye exam with interpretation by an ophthalmologist or optometrist documented and reviewed; with evidence of retinopathy
	2023F	Dilated retinal eye exam with interpretation by an ophthalmologist or optometrist documented and reviewed; without evidence of retinopathy
	3072F	Low risk for retinopathy (negative in prior year)
<b>BLOOD PRESSURE</b>		
<b>Controlling Blood Pressure (CBP)</b>	3074F	Most recent systolic blood pressure < 130 mm Hg
	3075F	Most recent systolic blood pressure 130-139 mm Hg
	3077F	Most recent systolic blood pressure ≥ 140 mm Hg
	3078F	Most recent diastolic blood pressure < 80 mm Hg
	3079F	Most recent diastolic blood pressure 80-89 mm Hg
	3080F	Most recent diastolic blood pressure ≥ 90 mm Hg
<b>CARE FOR OLDER ADULTS (COA)</b>		
<b>COA – Pain Screening</b>	1125F	Pain severity quantified; pain present
	1126F	Pain severity quantified; no pain present
<b>COA – Advanced Care Planning</b>	1158F	Advance care planning discussion documented in the medical record
<b>COA – Medication Review</b> NOTE: Both codes must be submitted.	1159F	Medication list documented in the medical record
	1160F	Review of all medications by a prescribing practitioner or clinical pharmacist documented in the medical record
<b>COA – Functional Status Assessment</b>	1170F	Functional status assessment (e.g., ADL/IADL) completed and documented in the medical record
<b>MEDICATION RECONCILIATION POST-DISCHARGE</b>		
<b>Transitions of Care (TRC) – Medication Reconciliation Post-Discharge</b>	1111F	Discharge medications reconciled with the current medication list in the outpatient medical record
